1. <u>Myrtle Spurge</u>	Several private and public	Lionsridge Loop area

2. <u>Absinth Wormwood</u>	Significant	Roads and open space
3. <u>Canada Thistle</u>	Significant	Roads and open space
4. Chinese Clematis	One occurrence	East Vail private garden
5. Common Tansy	Several patches	Parks, roadsides, private gardens
6. Dames Rocket	Patches	Roads and open space
7. <u>Dalmatian Toadflax</u>	Two occurrences	Open space
8. <u>Hoary Cress</u>	Patches	Roads and open space
9. Houndstongue	Patches	Roads and open space
10. <u>Leafy Spurge</u>	Several private and public	West Vail
11. Musk Thistle	Significant	Roads and open space
12. Oxeye Daisy	Significant	Roads and open space
13. Plumeless Thistle	Significant	Roads and open space
14. Russian Knapweed	One occurrence	East Vail
15. Russian Olive	Throughout	Landscape ornamental
16. Scentless Chamomile	Significant	Roads and open space
17. Scotch Thistle	One location	along Cortina Lane
18. Spotted Knapweed	One occurrence	East Vail
19. Sulfur Cinquefoil	Patches	Roads and Open space
20. <u>Yellow Toadflax</u>	Significant	Roads and open space

**Colorado List C Species**

21. Common Mullein	Significant	Roads and open space
22. Field Bindweed	Patches	Roads
23. Poison Hemlock	Patches	Wet areas along roads

- Highest Priority species are underlined
- There are 39 plants on List B. 19 were found within Town of Vail boundaries.
- There are 71 plants on the Colorado Noxious Weed list. 23 were found in Vail.
- Yellow Toadflax is currently the most damaging problem weed that the Town faces.
