- Adequate tires for the existing conditions
- Tire chains or alternative traction devices
- · Four-wheel drive

## **TIRE TREAD CHECK**

To check your treads at home, try the "quarter test." Place a quarter onto several tread grooves across the tire. If part of Washington's head is always covered by the tread, you should be fine (approximately 1/8").









## VAIL PASS CLOSURE | ALTERNATE ROUTES TO DENVER










## **TENNESSEE PASS** | 53 miles

- · Head west on I-70
- Take exit 171 to Minturn / Leadville (U.S. 24)
- · Go south over Tennessee Pass to Leadville
- At Leadville, head north on Colorado Highway 91 over Fremont Pass
- This will take you to Copper Mountain and I-70



## **BUENA VISTA** | 172 miles

- Head west on I-70
- Take exit 171 to Minturn / Leadville (U.S. 24)
- · Go south through Leadville to Buena Vista
- At Buena Vista, head north on U.S. 285
- · This will take you all the way to Denver



## KREMMLING | 103 - 172 miles

- Head west on I-70
- Take exit 157 at Wolcott / Steamboat Springs (Colorado Highway 131)
- Head north on Colorado Highway 131 to Toponas
- At Toponas, head east over Gore Pass on Colorado Highway 134
- Then south onto U.S. 40 to Kremmling TWO OPTIONS AT KREMMLING:
- 1. Head south on Colorado Highway 9 back to I-70 at Silverthorne (total of 103 miles)
- 2. Head east on U.S. 40 through Granby, over Berthoud Pass, to I-70 near Empire (total of 103 miles)
